Div. A, Sec 101, Pg 2	Funds the government through April 28, 2017, well into the next administration so President-elect Trump has the opportunity to confirm his cabinet. The base discretionary funding maintains the current budget cap level put in place under the BCA of 2011 at \$1.07T.	
Div. A, Sec 147, Pg 3	Allow funding at a rate of operations necessary for the Summer Electronic Benefit Transfer for Children (Summer EBT) Demonstration Projects.

Div. A, Sec 162, Pg 8-10	Addresses unobligated funds which have remained from previous fiscal years for the D.C. Opportunity Scholarship Program. Created under President Bush, this program provides scholarships to low-income families in Washington, D.C. to help offset the costs of private schooling. This bill would allow eligible entities to use remaining funds to provide additional scholarships. These amounts are to remain available until expended	
Div. A, Sec 163, Pg 10	Allows Homeland Security elements, including ICE, USCBP, TSA, and the Secret Service to be funded at a rate for operations necessary to sustain staffing levels and operations for ensuring border security and fulfilling enforcement priorities.	
Div. A, Sec 166, Pg 11	Allows funding at a rate of operations necessary to support newly constructed Indian Health facilities.	

Div. A, Sec. 167, Pgs 11-16	Extends health-care benefits for thousands of retired coal miners and their dependents through April 2017	Extends health-care benefits for retired coal miners through April 2017. Conservatives may be concerned that the bill would shift long-term funds for UMWA retiree health benefits to cover a four-month shortfall in funding immediate health care costs. This will result in the more rapid insolvency in the full program, potentially creating the need for a federal bailout.

A, Sec 168, Pg 16	Would increase the rate of operations for the cost of the Special Benefits appropriation from funds already collected from the fair share entities to pay a portion of the cost of administration of the Federal Employees' Compensation Act (FECA) related to compound prescription drug fraud.	
Div. A, Sec. 169, Pg 17	Would continue to make account maintenance fee payments to guarantee agencies under the Federal Family Education Loan program in FY 2017.	
Div. A, Sec. 170, Pg 17		Provides money after February 1, 2017, if needed, for housing and care of Unaccompanied Alien Children (UAC). Although we should care for the vulnerable, we're showing no signs of actually addressing the problem.
Div. A, Sec. 171, Pg 18-19		Would continue allocations of the Obamacare Prevention and Public Health Fund in FY 2017 and reduce the amount transferred to the CDC by \$1 million.
Div. A, Sec. 172, Pg 19	Would make an additional \$150 million available to the SSA for activities to address the hearing backlog of Disability Insurance claims. In FY 2016, these funds were allocated to construction of the SSA headquarters. As of March 2015, the SSA faced a backlog of about 1 million claims awaiting a decision, according to the SSA Office of Inspector General.	
Div. A, Sec. 173, Pg 19	Would continue the TANF program.	
Div. A, Sec. 174, Pg 19-20	Would authorize the Secretary of Health and Human Service to use discretionary appropriations to carry out a section of the Public Health Service Act related to the designation and investigation of potential cancer clusters. This would allow for implementation of Trevor's Law.	

Div. A, Sec. 175, Pg 20	No pay increase for Members of Congress.	
Div. A, Sec. 179, Pgs 26-31	Provides for expedited consideration for a waiver to consider General Mattis for Secretary of Defense, since he has served in the military in the last seven years.	
Div. A, Sec. 180, Pgs 31-33	Extends the suspension of the trucking hours-of-service rule until the DOT publishes their report that meets the criteria Congress laid out.	
Div. A, Sec. 185-192, Pgs 35-41	The measure contains \$4.1 billion in emergency disaster assistance to address damage from flood in Louisiana, West Virginia and Texas as well as damage from this fall's Hurricane Matthew.	Would provide an additional \$1.809 billion for the Community Development Block Grant. program. Of this total, \$1.4 billion is designated as for disaster relief and \$393 million is designated as an emergency. CDBG has paid for programs as diverse as doggie daycare, a local circus, and decorative sidewalks in an affluent suburb."
Div. A, Sec. 193-195, Pgs 41-43	Provides \$872 million for new health research initiatives under the 21st Century Cures Act. Funding is offset.	
Div. A, Sec. 196-201, Pgs 43-48	Funding is offset	Provides funding for the various programs related to Flint and other communities needing assistance due to lead-contamination.

B	The bill contains \$5.8 billion for the Department of Defense and \$4.3 billion for the State Department/USAID to support military and diplomatic efforts to fight ISIS and terror around the globe, to provide essential resources that will ensure our national security, and to increase the readiness of our troops.	OCO funding is not subject to the caps, and is regularly being used to fund things that would normally be in the base budget.
