

Questions for Dr. Fauci –

- COVID has had a disproportionate impact on Native Americans. The underlying challenges causing our tribes to be hard hit in the first place will still be around when we get to the resurgence of COVID in the fall. I know Indian Country will continue to have challenges receiving primary and secondary care services.
 - Recognizing these challenges, can you describe what considerations should be made for testing and treatment needs beyond what a response plan might be for the general population?
 - What do you think the role of the Federal government should be to ensure it is able to provide enough testing and treatment needs for our tribal communities?
- What do we know about the coronavirus today that we didn't know when we decided to shut down the economy?
- Will the coronavirus continue to be something we will have to continue to live with? What do you think new long-term best practices will be for public health?

Questions for Adm. Giroir –

- The Administration has made great strides in cutting back red tape and burdensome regulations in telehealth and these actions have been incredibly beneficial for providers and seniors in my district.
 - Does HHS plan to extend the regulatory relief for telehealth providers past the public health emergency?
- Can you discuss the accuracy of our public health data generally and in tribal communities? How long does it take to get accurate data on testing results, hospitalizations, mortality?
 - How accessible is data for providers?
- How can we be expected to make massive decisions on resources, if we don't have the data we need in a timely fashion or if it is inaccurate?
- Are efforts to improve the surveillance systems going to offer real-time data to providers who will need it?
- Should we consider claims data as a possible resource to know who has been tested, treated with a drug, and eventually immunized?
- In what ways could real-time clinical and prescription data be helpful in other pandemics or public health emergencies such as curbing the opioid epidemic or a future viral outbreak?
